#### 3. SHIP'S REGS ART 4202: ALARMS, BELLS, AND ANNOUNCING SYSTEMS

1. No person shall, without proper authority and due cause, tamper with, operate or otherwise disturb any contact maker used to sound the general, sonar, chemical or collision alarm.

2. The general announcing system (IMC) shall not be used without permission of the Officer of the Deck except in emergencies. The use of this system shall be restricted to matters of general importance. Words shall not be passed for officers or enlisted men except in emergencies or when their immediate presence is necessary for the operation of the ship or equipment.

3. No person shall strike the ship's bell without permission of the officer of the deck, and then only to indicate the time, as a fire alarm, or as a fog signal when at anchor.

4. Boat gongs shall be sounded only by direction of the officer of the deck to indicate the prospective departure of officers' boats and the arrival and departure of visiting Commanding Officers, flag officers, and the Commanding Officer.

#### SHIP'S REGS ART. 4203: ALCOHOL AND NARCOTICS

1. All narcotics in this ship shall be in the custody of the medical and or dental officer as directed by the Commanding Officer. All alcohol designated for treatment of medical or dental patients, either directly or indirectly, will be in the custody of the medical and/or dental officer. No one shall have access to this material except as prescribed by these officers. Alcohol used for other purposes and alcoholic beverages in transit as cargo shall be in the custody of the Supply Officer.



2. These officers shall supervise in person all receipts and issues of alcohol, alcoholic beverages, and narcotics in their custody and shall keep proper records of all transactions to ensure strict accountability and to detect losses promptly. Only heads of departments are authorized to sign requests for the issue of alcohol. It shall be drawn only in limited quantities sufficient for immediate use, and issued only to responsible petty officers. The person to whom alcohol is issued for use shall be responsible for ensuring that;

- a. It is used only for the purpose for which issued.
- b. It is withheld from unauthorized persons.
- c. The unused portion is returned immediately to the officer from whom it was drawn.
- d. It is protected from theft.

3. With the exception of medical and dental officers, no person shall prescribe or administer any narcotics, either to himself or to another person, except to aid the injured during action or emergencies. The medical and dental officers may authorize certain hospital corpsmen and dental technicians to administer narcotics to patients in sick bay in accordance with the medical or dental officer's prescription.

4. When no medical officer is attached, all alcohol, alcoholic beverages, and narcotics shall be in the custody of a commissioned officer, who shall be designated the alcohol and narcotics control officer. Small quantities of these substances may be issued to the leading petty officer in the medical department. The bulk alcohol and narcotics shall, if possible, be kept in a three combination safe or, if this is not possible, under lock and key. All issues will be receipted for. The alcohol and narcotics control officer will maintain proper records of the materials in his custody. Such issues will be covered by prescription. Narcotics and alcohol will be accounted for monthly by a special auditing board appointed for this purpose.

5. Except as stated above, the introduction, possession or use of alcoholic beverages for any purpose is prohibited.
