

TOURS ORIGINATING IN

OCHO RIOS

OR1 — OCHO RIOS HIGHLIGHTS — 3 HRS.

J\$6.00 — \$6.80 per person, depending on hotel location. Daily from start. point at 8:45 a.m. and 1:45 p.m.

First, visit to PINEAPPLE PLACE shopping centre. Thru the haunting loveliness of FERN GULLY, thru Claremont to Lydford to see the ore of aluminum being mined. A visit to the COLUMBUS MEMORIAL near St. Ann's Bay follows. DUNN'S RIVER FALLS which cascades into the blue Caribbean can be seen on the way back.



OR5 — PLANTATION TOUR — 4½ HRS.

J\$8.00 — J\$9.60 per person depending on hotel location. Departs from starting point at 9:15 a.m and 2:00 p.m. daily except Saturdays.

Eastward to Port Maria and BRIMMER HALL one of Jamaica's finest plantations. In a gay, open-air jitney you will tour the estate and discover for yourself the fascinating stages of coconut, banana and small crop cultivation — how each is planted, tended and finally harvested. There is also a fine shopping centre and unique Eating House, serving Jamaican food.



OR8 — INLAND TOUR TO KINGSTON — ALL DAY.
J\$10.40 — J\$12.00 per person depending on hotel location. Daily except Sun. from start. point 8:00 a.m.

Inland thru FERN GULLY and Moneague, past Linstead and Bog Walk to SPANISH TOWN, Jamaica's capital until 1872, visiting the Folk Museum there. On to KINGSTON and a stop for luncheon (not included in tour price) and shopping. Return via a completely different route which includes CASTLETON GARDENS.

OR9 — BROWNS TOWN MARKET TOUR — 4 HRS.

J\$6.00 — J\$8.00 per person depending on hotel location. Departs from start. point 8:30 a.m. on Wednesdays, Fridays and Saturdays. Minimum of 4 persons.

Along the coast to SEVILLA NUEVA and RUNAWAY BAY where the Spanish fled in 1658. Then follows a gradual climb past ORANGE VALLEY to Brown's Town where the highlight is a visit to the local market. After refreshments, the tour passes thru PHILADELPHIA, CHIPENHAM PARK and BAMBOO on the return trip to Ocho Rios.

OR10 — RAFTING ON THE MARTHA BRAE — 7 HRS.

J\$11.20 — J\$13.60 per person depending on hotel location. Departs daily from starting point at 9:00 a.m. Minimum of 4 persons.

Drive westerly along the coast past Dunn's River Falls, St. Ann's Bay, SEVILLA NUEVA to RUNAWAY BAY where the Spanish fled in 1658. Then on to DISCOVERY BAY — site of Columbus' first landing in 1494, on past RIO BUENO to FALMOUTH and RAFTERS VILLAGE, where your trip down river begins. After your ride on the "Martha Brae" and lunch (not included in tour) you drive leisurely back to your hotel via the coast road.

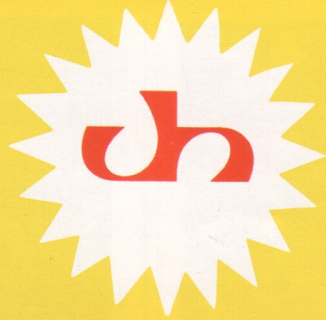
OR6 — RAFTING ON THE RIO GRANDE — ALL DAY.

J\$13.20 — J\$14.80 per person depending on hotel location. Daily from starting point 8:30 a.m.

Eastward past Oracabessa, Port Maria and numerous picturesque villages to PORT ANTONIO and Berrydale where you board your raft for the 7-mile glide over bubbling rapids and placid shallows with stops for picnic lunch (not included in price) and a swim. Your car will be waiting at river's end.

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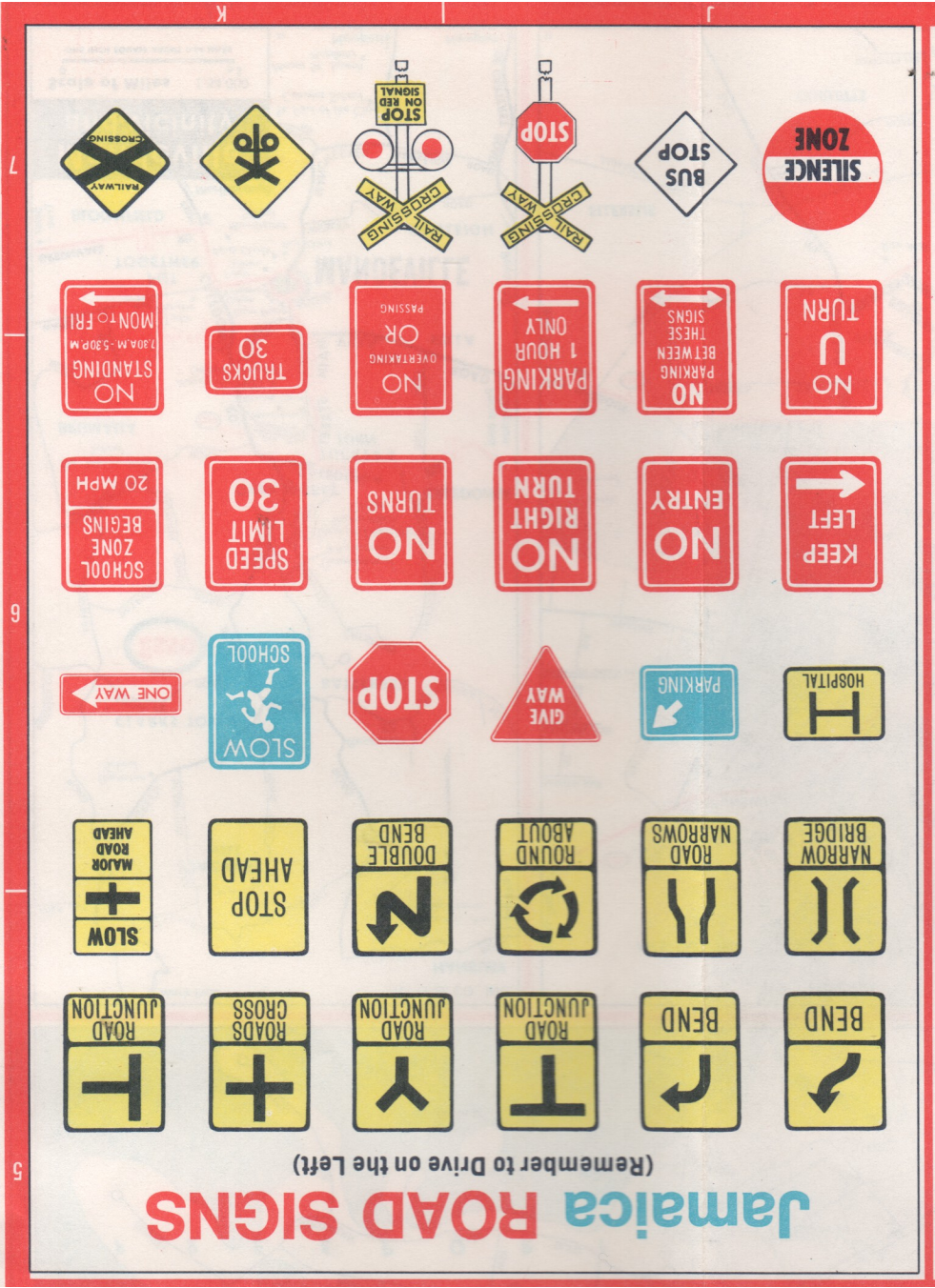
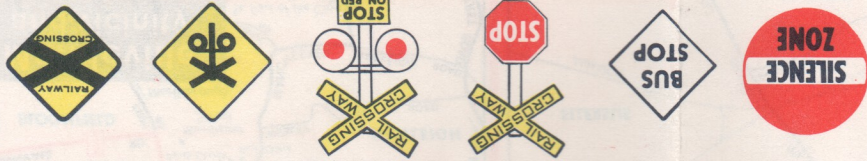
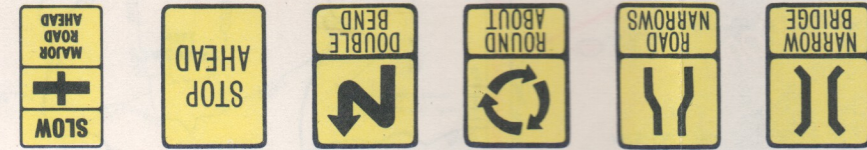
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Jamaica ROAD SIGNS
